# **Election Day is November 6**



Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Check for information about poll locations and find other voter resources at **vote.minneapolismn.gov**.

#### **Voter Registration**

The first step to voting is registering. You can: 1) preregister online or submit paper application in person or by mail, or 2) register at the polls.

You need to re-register to vote if you have:

- Moved to a new address since you last registered.
- Changed your name since last being registered.
- Have not voted at least once in the last 4 years.

Check if you are registered to vote under your current name and address at **vote.minneapolismn.gov/voters/REGISTER** 

#### Early Voting: September 21 to November 5

Don't want to wait in line on Election Day? Vote early! All voters in Minnesota can choose to vote before Election Day by absentee ballot without providing a reason. You can vote by mail or early in-person, starting 46 days before each election.

#### Vote-By-Mail

Vote-By-Mail (VBM) enables active military service members and their families, voters who are overseas or away from home on Election Day, and anyone who otherwise cannot cast a ballot at the polls on Election Day to participate. #### Early In-Person Voting – Early Vote Center

The main in-person early voting location will be the Downtown Early Vote Center at 217 S. Third Street. Early Voting will begin on September 21. Service hours will be Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Starting October 22, EVS will extend service hours: Monday to Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.; Saturdays, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.; and Sundays from 12:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

#### **Direct Balloting**

Direct Balloting for the general election begins on Tuesday, October 30, and enables voters to cast their ballot by putting it directly in the tabulator, just like on Election Day. Per a 2016 change to state election law, local jurisdictions now have the option to offer in-person voters the option to insert their ballots directly into a ballot tabulator, instead of sealing them into an envelope to be processed and tabulated later.

## Ward 13 Update From Council Member Linea Palmisano



Dropping our oldest son, Charlie, off for his first day of second grade at Lake Harriet Lower Elementary School really drove home the fact that fall is upon us. It has been such a non-stop, busy summer at City Hall that I hardly noticed the time fly by. From City Charter change proposals, to the comprehensive

plan drafts, to public safety issues and more, this has been one of the busiest summers during my time as your 13th Ward City Council Member.

Last newsletter, I asked you to engage thoughtfully in the draft of our city's long-range planning document, the Minneapolis 2040 Comprehensive Plan. Much of the feedback we received has been constructive and informed, and really shows just how connected the people of Southwest Minneapolis are with local issues. I look forward to the next step of that process come October, and you can sign up for my ward emails to stay in the loop on next steps.

This same spirit was exemplified in the primary election when 11,069 of you participated in deciding who would and would not make it onto the November 6th ballot. That's almost a 32% increase in turnout from the 2016 primary! With the November general election closing in, I am excited to see that level of enthusiasm for civic engagement grow, and there are many ways to get involved. Did you know that election judges are needed across Minneapolis this November 6th? Election judges are paid for their service, which includes training. It is an opportunity to learn more about the election process, and it's an important service to our community. If you are interested, visit vote.minneapolismn.gov or call 612-673-3000.

Less known than all the political races on your ballot this fall are two ballot measures for voters to learn about and consider: schools and liquor. The first ballot measure is about additional property tax funding for the school district, both an operational and technology-specific fund. The second ballot measure is related to our City Charter. If adopted, it would change the process of how businesses and restaurants obtain liquor licenses in our city.

No matter where you choose to spend your time, I hope you enjoy fall – my favorite season – and find time for good conversation about all the things happening locally and beyond.

# Minneapolis Climate Action

Thanks to committed residents, Linden Hills currently has over 60 percent participation in the Minneapolis organics recycling program – one of the highest rates in the city. Bring your passion and commitment to help Minneapolis Climate Action get that rate to 80%!

We are coordinating a Hennepin County grant, with the support of the City of Minneapolis, to increase organics recycling in Linden Hills. Our goal is to recruit and train Compost Captains to doorknock blocks with lower rates of organics recycling and help neighbors sign up and get started. Neighbors who sign up will be given a free starter kit that includes a countertop bin, bags, and information on setting up organics recycling.

The Compost Captain who signs up the most neighbors by September 26th will receive an iPad (val. \$353), and those who sign up the 2nd and 3rd most will win a \$100 and \$50 gift card respectively.

Door-knocking is a great way to connect in this age of digital activism. Together we can keep organics out of our incinerator and use them to create healthy soil to fight climate change!
