



Frozen Art Festival Debuts on Lake Harriet

Saturdays & Sundays, January 20 – February 11, 10 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Open regardless of weather - On Lake Harriet, north side near the Band Shell



Art Shanty Projects, the uniquely Minnesotan festival created each year atop a frozen lake, will occur for the first time in Minneapolis on Lake Harriet. The move was accomplished with the support of the Linden Hills Neighborhood Council and the Minneapolis Park & Recreation Board.

For over a decade, Art Shanty Projects has organized a monthlong transformation of an ice-covered body of water into an artist-designed village filled with creative structures, interactive activities and lively performances.

The On-Ice Program is free and open to the public 10 a.m. -4 p.m., every Saturday and Sunday from January 20 through February 11, regardless of weather. This event is estimated to attract more than 25,000 visitors during its four-week run. The shanty village will be located either on the frozen lake or on shore near the bandshell, depending on ice conditions.

Make Your Home More Energy Efficient

Would you like to find a way to keep your heating bills down and eliminate energy waste? Consider getting a home energy audit.

Linden Hills Neighborhood Council (LHiNC) has partnered with the Center for Energy and Environment (CEE) to provide Linden Hills residents with a 50% discount for a Home Energy Squad Enhanced visit, a program provided by CenterPoint Energy and Xcel Energy.

When you make an appointment with the Home Energy Squad, technicians will come and assess opportunities for increased efficiency. The visit includes a test to measure air leaks, infrared imaging, an insulation inspection, a heating system and water heater safety test, and installation of energy and money-saving materials.



Upon completion of the inspection, homeowners receive a customized report that includes an efficiency score, summary of the findings, and specific recommendations for next steps. The Home Energy Squad also provides quotes and can schedule a meeting with a contractor for homeowners that want to get started on energy projects right away.

If you've been dealing with persistent problems like ice dams and drafts, or if you are a new homeowner curious about having your home's efficiency assessed, the Home Energy Squad can help.

The Home Energy Squad Enhanced visit is normally offered at a cost of \$100. But Linden Hills residents pay just \$50.To schedule an appointment, please call (651) 328-6220 or visit **mncee.org/hes/minneapolis.**

City Plans Pedestrian Safety Upgrade at 47th & Xerxes

Public Works has selected Southwest High School for its 2018 Safe Routes to School (SRTS) project. The SRTS program provides strategic planning, funding and other support for infrastructure projects that encourage more children to travel to school using active forms of transportation, such as walking and bicycling.

The scope of the project predominantly includes the intersection located at 47th Street West and Xerxes Avenue South. Public Works has developed a preliminary design that includes:

- Curb extensions, with new ADA pedestrian ramps, extending into Xerxes Avenue South at all four corners of the intersection;
- A push-activated overhead pedestrian flasher with four Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons; and
- New pavement markings including "zebra" crosswalks and a stop bar.



Minor enhancements are also proposed at the intersection located at 47th Street West and Beard Avenue South. These elements include:

- Pedestrian crossing signage and
- New "zebra" crosswalks.

The proposed project is scheduled to occur over the course of the 2018 construction season. Public Works is currently in the preliminary stages of planning and design for the project, which will be accompanied by community outreach activities that will help inform and guide design concepts.

If you have questions or comments about the project, a Public Works representative will be at the next Linden Hills Neighborhood Council meeting on February 6 from 7-9pm at the Linden Hills Park Building to present the project and address any community concerns.
