The 44th Annual Linden Hills Festival returns to Linden Hills Park on **Sunday, May 20** from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. The festival, organized by the Linden Hills Neighborhood Council, promises to offer all of the fan favorites from the bike parade to bouncy houses PLUS new, exciting additions, like a bocce ball and a beer garden. 



Bocce Ball Arrives in Linden Hills – Festival Debut

Several long time Linden Hills residents are building a neighborhood bocce ball court in Linden Hills Park, in partnership with the Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board (MPRB). The court will be debuted at the May 20th Linden Hills Festival.



Dale Mulfinger, Rick Polanski, Marc Burgett and Steve Benson plan to raise the \$12,000-\$14,000 necessary to build the two-lane regulation sized court. So far, MPRB has allocated \$5,000 of the neighborhood's park dedication fees to the project, Linden Hills Neighborhood Council has awarded the group a \$1000 grant, plus \$2,000 has been raised through private fundraising.

Minneapolis Parks & Recreation Board has formed a Community Advisory Committee (CAC) to create a 20-year Southwest Service Area Master Plan. The Southwest Service Area contains 42 neighborhood parks and 13 recreation centers south of I-394 and west of I-35W.

The CAC will draft improvement plans that specifically address the needs of each neighborhood

park asset. These improvements will be implemented over the next 20 years.

Our Linden Hills neighborhood has 1 recreation center and 4 parks. One goal of the Linden Hills Neighborhood Council is to create a walking and bike path that follows the Historic Trolley Path from Waveland Triangle to Lake Harriet.

Linden Hills residents Jana Griffin and Shaelyn Crutchley have both been appointed to the CAC and will represent Linden Hills, CIDNA and West Calhoun neighborhoods and their respective park assets. Below are the winners from the latest round of grants, as voted on by LHiNC.

Eric Peterson scholarships - Each spring, LHiNC awards a \$1000 scholarship to two SWHS seniors selected by the school for their dedication to community service, in memory of a past board member who dedicated his life to serving others.

Lake Harriet Lower and the STEAM program: To support the elementary school's library/media classroom in its transition to a "Makerspace model", an approach that allows students to develop skills in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math).

Midwest Food Connection: To support this organization's work providing interactive lessons on local and global cuisine to elementary school students in the Linden Hills neighborhood. This group educates students on topics such as nutrition, agriculture and gardening, and the historical and cultural context of food.

SW Robotics: In support of this group's goal to make robotics more broadly available to local middle school students. Through this program, students design, build, and program a robot for competition; they gain valuable experience in technology, teamwork, marketing, public speaking, and community outreach.

Celebrate Memorial Day at Lakewood Cemetery

Monday, May 28, 10:30 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Lakewood Cemetery, 3600 Hennepin Ave.

Immerse yourself in history and honor lives lost at Lakewood's annual Memorial Day Celebration. A ceremony honoring veterans begins at 10:30 a.m. followed by an afternoon (12 p.m. – 3 p.m.) of WWI-era inspired activities - community sings, a make-and-take planting activity, guided walking tours, and more - all to commemorate the 100^{th} anniversary of the end of World War I.

The Linden Hills Festival has been a Zero Waste event since 2008. This means that almost all waste generated at the Festival gets recycled or composted, so at the end of the day we have very little that goes into the landfill - typically just one small bag of trash.

Look for our Zero Waste stations at the Festival and help us in this effort!



The annual Linden Hills Festival is organized by LHiNC Board members - a group of committed volunteers, who help make a difference in our special neighborhood. These are regular people with families and jobs, and somehow they make time to contribute.

Amazing feats performed by the LHiNC board:

- Navigating the City's complex world of permit applications for food, tents, beer, and the parade (not as easy as you may think)
- Figuring out how much soda and cotton candy to order for a crowd of 3,000
- Counting and tracking an estimated 30,000 tickets sold
- Learning about the Minneapolis Health Department and how to pass the surprise health inspection on Festival day
- Planning for a beautiful day ... and having a backup plan in case it rains

The Festival requires LOTS of time and planning, but the big payoff is carrying on the annual Festival tradition. It's fun!
