Election Update

Early Voting Starts September 17 for 2021 Municipal Elections

Any Minneapolis voter may choose to vote early, no reason needed. The Early Vote Center at 980 E. Hennepin Ave. opens at 8:00 a.m. Sept. 17 for voters who wish to cast their ballot early and in person. The last day for early voting is November 1.



Go to <u>vote.minneapolismn.gov</u> for early voting times, mail-in ballots requests, voter registration, polling locations and more.

What's on the ballot?

Offices on the ballot this year include: Mayor, City Council, Board of Estimate & Taxation, and Park & Recreation Board. For complete list of candidates: wote.minneapolismn.gov/run-for-office/candidate-filings/

Streetcar Line Turns Fifty

On August 28, 1971, the Minnesota Streetcar Museum offered the first trips on its restored Como-Harriet Streetcar Line. This August, fifty years later, volunteers and neighbors gathered, despite pouring rain, to celebrate the milestone (see photo). The museum acknowledged its volunteers, some of whom were there fifty years ago, and Linden Hills neighbors for their ridership and support.

Bryant Avenue Streetcar Line with Aaron Isaacs

From 1890 to 1953, the Bryant Avenue streetcar line served the Lyn-Lake and East Harriet neighborhoods, traveling from Lyndale Avenue to Lake Street, then east and south of Lake Harriet across Minnehaha Creek. LHiNC has five committees; community members are welcome to attend meetings and to join. Below is a look at what each committee has been up to this summer. Please email info@lindenhills.org, if you'd like to learn more.

Community Engagement meets the last Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. Over the summer, the committee launched an interactive Community Calendar, so local groups can promote their events at lindenhills.org/submit-event; supported National Night Out by providing a gift for kids to all interested block captains; partnered with St. John's Episcopal Church and League of Women Voters to organize a Ward 13 Candidates Forum; and started planning the launch of a Business Sub-Committee (see details above).

Environment and Sustainability meets the third Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. This summer, the committee partnered with Metro Blooms to bring five rain gardens to Linden Hills homeowners, continued planting and tending native plants and pollinators on the Trolley Path, funded and oversaw the installation of bike racks at Beard and 44th and outside Wooden Ship Brewing, and continued promoting its Pesticide-Free Campaign.

Equity meets the second Thursday of the month at 7:00 p.m. This summer, the committee organized three educational events: *How to Start (and Continue) Being an Anti-Racist* with Monique Walker and *Beyond What You See: Parts 1 and 2* with Andre Hudson and Michael Bratsch. They also partnered with Boys and Girls Clubs of the Twin Cities for a Back to School Supply Drive. Watch for details for the LHiNC Holiday Food and Toy Drive later this fall.

Events meets the third Thursday of the month at 7:00 p.m. The committee spent summer organizing Linden Hills Fall Festival scheduled for September 18, 2021 from 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. at Linden Hills Park. Zoning and Housing meets the second Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. This summer, the committee hosted neighbors and a developer to discuss a proposed apartment building at 44th and Abbott, hosted a table at Linden Hills Farmers Market to inform renters about the eviction moratorium and invited City of Lakes Community Land Trust to join them and promote their city-wide affordable housing programs. They also reviewed planned projects requiring variances in the neighborhood.
